



Lucky Thirteen

On Wednesday, May 19th, thirteen lucky *Merrie Ladies* and their spouses were treated to an outstanding tour of the Kamaka Ukulele Factory on South Street. Fred Kamaka, son of the original founder of the factory, Sam Kamaka, kept us entertained as well as informed on the history of ukuleles and the story behind the Kamaka factory.

Samuel Kai'ali'ili'i Kamaka, Sr., started making ukuleles in the basement of his Kaimuki home in 1916. Today, three generations continue the family business, Kamaka Hawai'i, Inc.

Four generations of Kamaka luthiers have developed ukulele-making techniques that create durable, exquisite koa instruments that improve with age. The value of a koa Kamaka ukulele comes not only from its fine quality craftsmanship, but from its heritage. A little known fact is that before any ukulele leaves the shop, it must first pass inspection by one of the Kamaka sons. Obtaining a Kamaka ukulele means acquiring a legacy, a cherished family heirloom that can be passed on from one generation to the next.

After our tour, the group had a fellowship lunch at the Spaghetti Factory at the Ward Warehouse. A big thank you to **Anna Blackwell** for managing the interesting tour and satisfying lunch. **Marion**
