

#### **IN MEMORIAM**

Samuel K. Apuna, Jr., 81, PhD, LTC, USA, Retired; Life Member, Aloha Chapter, MOAA, of Mesa, AZ; Died on December 13, 2010.

Dr. Apuna, born on July 29, 1929, in Honolulu, T.H., served three tours in Vietnam, later becoming the Deputy Comptroller for the US Army Reserves Component Personnel and Administration. After 23 years of active duty, he retired in 1976 as a Lieutenant Colonel.



Sam earned a Doctorate in Business Administration and was an instructor at the University of Hawaii. He served on The Advisory Committee to the US Veterans Administration and helped found additional chapters of the

Military Officers Association of America.

He is survived by his wife of 30 years, Sandi (who is now a Life Auxiliary Member of the Aloha Chapter), 2 sons and 3 daughters and their respective spouses, and 11 grandchildren.

### **IN MEMORIAM**

Robert R. Deibler, 84, Captain, USN, Retired; Life Member, Aloha Chapter, MOAA, of Honolulu, HI; Died on December 17, 2010.

CAPT Robert Deibler served over 31 years in the Navy at 5 major commands, at sea and ashore. He was the commissioning commanding officer of *USS Wichita* (AOR-1), the lead ship of a new class of replenishment oilers. After retirement from the Navy, he was active in charitable organizations, serving as USO Hawaii President and receiving prestigious international awards from the Rotary Club.

He is survived by his wife Mimi (now a Life Auxiliary Member) and daughter Debbie.

LTCOL. Nakagawa was selected as the Junior Officer of the month at Travis Air Force Base, CA. At the time, Nakagawa was a lieutenant and navigator with the 84th Military Airlift Squadron. He received the honor for his extraordinary professionalism and dedication to duty. On April 30, 1967, LT Nakagawa was aboard a 60th Military Airlift Wing C-133 aircraft that was forced to ditch in the South China Sea. C-133s had a deserved reputation of being accident prone. It was stated on that occasion that he acted with poise and courage and that his actions contributed greatly to the crew's ability to pull through the emergency successfully.

He was later awarded the Air Medal for his performance during this emergency ditching in the ocean. Through his sustained superior performance, Nakagawa made further outstanding contributions to the accomplishments of the 60th Wing's mission.

intermittent Christmas CD's heard during the evening. Surprisingly, it turned out to be another record-breaking evening of high scores.


