
merchandise in the world. One of the critical items exported is computer chips; the United States imports about 71% of its computer chips from Taiwan which are used in everything nowadays from appliances and cars to missiles.

Under their Southbound Policy, the multiparty democracy of Taiwan is deepening its ties across the board with the 10 Association of Southeast Asian Nations member states, 6 South Asian countries, Australia and New Zealand.

Director General Lin's articulate presentation had his audience enthralled and impressed with the vital importance of Taiwan in Asia and to the world.

During the concluding question-and-answer period, he was asked if he thought American troops would defend Taiwan, as President Biden has stated four times that they would. He diplomatically answered that there are already over a thousand American military already on Taiwan. It was reassuring when he replied in the affirmative that Taiwan has the Patriot anti-missile defense like Israel's Iron Dome.

Everyone learned more about the strategic and economic importance of Taiwan and greatly appreciated Director General Lin's talk.

Boat Tour from Front Page

The original plan for our rescheduled tour in February was to have our luncheon at a restaurant near the Pearl Harbor Boathouse at noon followed by the tour at 1400. However, shortly before this newsletter was to be published, the sailors at the boathouse informed Mike that our tour was preempted by some VIPs and our time was moved up to 1245. When he could not get a confirmation from the restaurant regarding our revised reservation time after repeated calls, he finally had to make a reservation elsewhere.

If you intend to go on the boat tour in the admiral's barge around Ford Island and/or the luncheon, read to the end of this article.

An admiral's barge is not a vessel, usually flat-bottomed and with or without its own power, used for transporting freight, especially on canals and rivers. In the Navy it is a boat allocated to a flag officer for use in ceremonial occasions and often carried on board his flagship.

Authorized uses for flag barges include hosting community leaders and foreign dignitaries, or military ceremonies. Barges



are not used for recreational activities or purely social events, nor are they provided for personal use. Other commands that have flag barges include the chief of naval operations and Navy Region Hawaii.

The admiral's barge is used for official tours of Pearl Harbor that offer a unique opportunity to share Hawaii's significant history and to highlight the United States' resolve, resilience and determination in times of adversity and peace. These tours reinforce the strategic importance of our military installations and supporting commands based in Hawaii.

The COMPACFLT Admirals Boathouse offers a guided tour that includes a tour of the boat house, a talk in the photo and model museum, a historical video and then a narrated tour on the Remembrance Barge that goes out and around Ford Island, past the USS UTAH and USS NEVADA sites and then docs at the Arizona Memorial. You are there for about 20 minutes before they return you to the boathouse.

Attire for all Federal civil servants and civilian guests:

- Aloha (closed-toe shoes, pants, Aloha shirt tucked or untucked for men)
- High heels, flip-flops, opentoed sandals, short skirts, cut offs, jeans and tank tops are not allowed
- Civilian attire should be appropriate to pay respect to our fallen Shipmates.

Parking is available right outside of the boathouse or inside the boathouse compound.



Take the road to the USS ARI-ZONA Memorial from Kamehameha Highway, turn right, continue past Restaurant 604 (the old Marina Restaurant) to the end of the road where the COMPACFLT Admirals Boathouse is located (the orange balloon on the above map).

We need to assemble at 1245 on Tuesday, 21 February. Don't be late and miss the boat (UCMJ Article 87—Missing Ship's Movement).

After our free tour we will have a late lunch at the Lanai at Mamala Bay Restaurant on Hickam AFB, JBPHH. It will not be a buffet. We will order from the menu in our private room. Thus, since we will pay for our own meals, there is no Reservation Form.

If you intend to take either the boat tour or just go to the luncheon or both, call **Mark Webster**'s answering machine at 808-734-5994 ASAP.. The capacity of the boat is reserved for the **first 35 members** and their guests who call.
